My interests form two interdigitated lines of research. 1) I am interested in translational research on personality disorders and integrating treatment approaches to improve clinical care for individuals with personality disorders. 2) I am attempting to further refine our understanding of phenotypes of personality pathology, using machine learning and other artificial intelligence approaches, such as factor mixture modeling and other latent classification techniques, to address this issue. Cutting across my work, I am currently integrating forensic psychology, attachment theory, impulsivity, trauma, and pain research, and ecological momentary assessment to better understand personality and its correlates, particularly in forensic contexts.
